
The oldest geographical society in the nation, established i1851. We promote the use of geography and geo-spatial science in business, government, research and education.













International Migrant Stock as % of the Total Population








Figure 1 Number of immigrants and immigrants as percentage of the U.S. population, 1850 - present. Source: U.S. Census Bureau (Economics Draft Report).

Ketchup

Ketchup comes from the Hokkien Chinese word, kêtsiap, the name of a sauce derived from fermented fish. It is believed that traders brought fish sauce from Vietnam to southeastern China.

The British likely encountered ketchup in Southeast Asia, returned home, and tried to replicate the fermented dark sauce.

Pre-Columbian – found in Central America and the Andes. A mixture of chili peppers and (sometimes) tomatoes. It is the #1 Condiment in the US






Sriracha Sauce

Thai origins, made with chili peppers, vinegar, and garlic. A dipping sauce, also used in Vietnam. Yet the Sriracha in most US supermarkets was created by a Vietnamese refugee, David Tran in Los Angeles.






Daily Plane of Removals from the U.S. landing in Guatemala City




